




The Parts of a Crater



- Floor Bottom of a crater, sometimes bowl-shaped, sometimes flat
- Central peak A "mountain" in the central area of the floor of very large craters
- Walls Interior sides of a crater (usually steep)
- **Rim** Edge of the crater hole. Usually raised
- Ejecta Material thrown out of the crater area during an impact event

Rays – Bright streaks extending away from the crater, sometimes for great distances, made of ejecta material
